

YOUNG INVESTIGATOR'S AWARD

To encourage young scientists to participate in the conference, a young investigators award program has been established. Four 1200 EURO travel awards and a diploma will be granted to young investigators submitting high quality manuscripts. In order to be considered, a candidate must:

- Provide documentation that they are either currently enrolled as a student, or have completed a PhD within the last five years
- Submit a senior-authored manuscript (7 page limit) for consideration
- Submit this manuscript by **1 June 2005**

Selection will be based on scientific quality of the manuscript. Each manuscript will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- The paper advances the state of knowledge in an area of science promoted at the conference
- The research idea is innovative and has interdisciplinary implications
- The study design is of high quality
- The discussion section is clear
- The conclusions are well supported by the data presented
