There is no currently existing national state of environment reports, which is due to the lack of functional meteorological stations network in the country (at the moment). However, there is a compilation of climate change data on Somalia (including long term trends), that FSAU and FEWSNET Projects regularly review for analysis. Primary data source for this information is NOAA/USGS and MARS-JRC.

**Archiving a long-term management of new ASCLME data:**

There is no current data centre for the Clearing House Mechanism (CHM) within the focal point institution. However, following discussions with the focal point, there may be the possibility of utilizing such a centre to store newly acquired information, including oceanographic, bathymetric and fisheries data in near future. Regarding the curation and storing of fish and invertebrate specimens from cruises, this aspect is not possible, since our country is currently lacking the infrastructure and resources required for the upkeep and maintenance of these specimens. Furthermore, we do hope to

establish a regional cooperation on this matter, especially with the South African Institute for Aquatic Biodiversity (SAIAB).
