1. Rationale of Benefit Sharing

- Priority is given to hydropower development in Viet Nam's legislation: 18,000MW by 2015
- Location of Hydro Power Plans (HPPs): Mountainous areas
- Beneficiaries from HPPs: citizens
- Awareness is growing, where:
 - o All people adversely affected by hydropower projects need support in long term.
 - o Local actions (by affected communities) can help to sustainably manage hydropower assets over the longer-term.
 - o Benefit Sharing Mechanism for Adversely Affected People by Hydro Power Projects



2. Legal Framework

- 1. To advance sustainable development of hydropower "Development meeting needs of the present generation without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs, on the basis of a close and harmonized combination of economic growth, assurance of social advancement and environmental protection". (LoEP, 2005, Article 3)
- 2. Three generic forms of benefit sharing reflected, to varying degrees, in primary and secondary laws in the power, water, forestry, and environment sectors:
 - Equitably sharing of electricity access & services
 - Entitlements for enhancing resources access
 - Revenue sharing




2. Legal Framework (cont)

- 1. Key social policies for priority development of minorities and communes and areas of difficult or extremely difficult socio-economic conditions.
- 2. To treat local communities as long-term partners
 - Incentive for local action to sustainably manage hydro assets, and:
 - Help maintain long term revenue flows from the project
- 3. To have other comparative advantages (e.g.)
 - Risk reduction for all stakeholders including investors
 - Mobilizing capital enhanced access to international finance



3. Guidelines



Coincide with competitive generation market rules to be introduced in 2009



3. Guidelines (cont)

- 1. State encourages 3 forms of benefit sharing
- 2. Project-specific revenue sharing fund
- 3. Benefit sharing council
- 4. Eligible parties defined for benefit-sharing
- 5. Grant application procedure for revenuesharing investments




3. Guidelines (cont)

Revenue sharing: a relationship between groups of electricity consumers

- is reflected in the tariff
- is a pass-through in respect to the hydropower entity
- Revenue sharing is <u>NOT</u> between the hydropower entities and affected people.
 - except to extent investments made by revenue sharing help stabilize long-term generation and revenue (mutually beneficial)
 - and can not be profit sharing based.



Definitions include who is adversely Affected – "Eligible parties" in project impact zone






4. Implementation
